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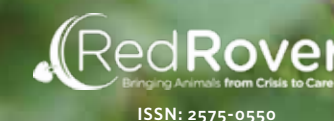

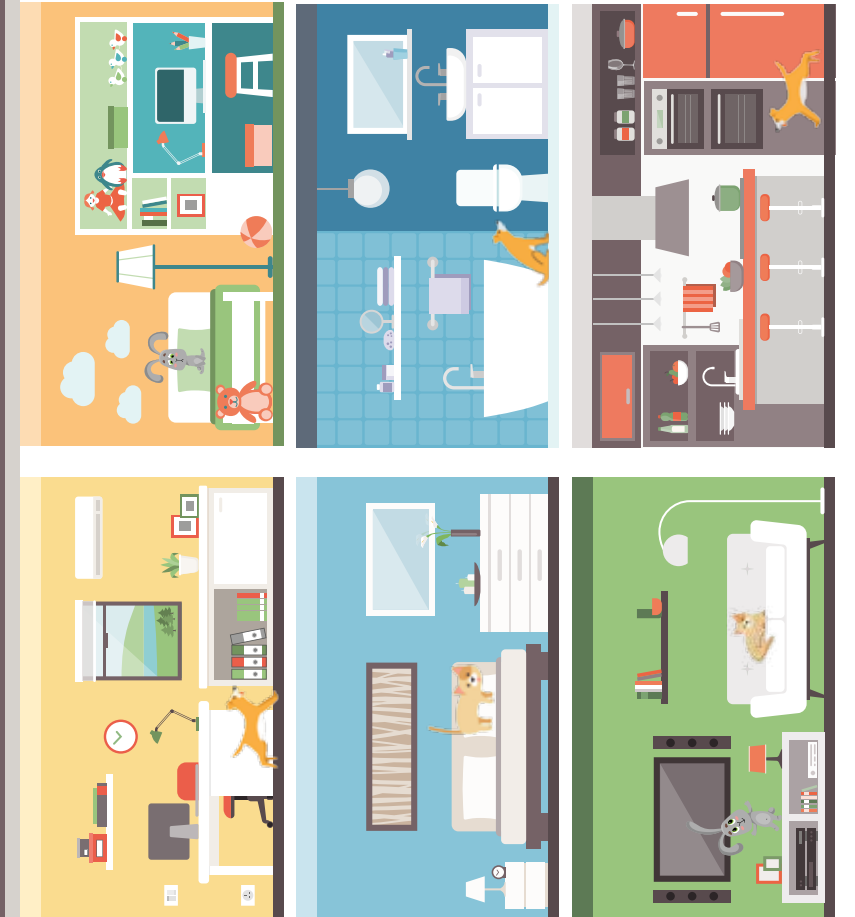

# How Dogs Say

## I'M MAD

### A friend grabs a toy away from you. How do you feel?

If you said “angry,” you are not alone. Both people and dogs may feel angry when another person or dog tries to take a favorite toy or food away from them.

Both people and dogs **communicate** when they are mad. A human face might look mad. A dog’s face and body can look mad, too. But, they look mad in different ways.

It is important to stay away from both angry dogs and angry people. A dog could try to bite if you get too close!

### SIGNS A DOG IS ANGRY

- Lips curled back
- Growling
- Showing teeth
- Barking
- Fur standing up
- Ears back
- Pushing whiskers forward



Look at both pictures. Both dogs have their mouths open. Both dogs are showing their teeth.



But this dog has lips pulled back and whiskers pulled forward. This is a sure sign to **STAY BACK!**

# Leaving — young —

Human families don't usually leave young children alone. Some wild animals are different. They hide their babies and go find food. They don't go that far.

Rabbit mothers will leave their babies in a nest on the ground with grass covering them. Does (female deer) leave their fawns in tall grass for several hours. After leaving the nest, baby birds spend time on the ground without their parents as they learn to fly.



*These baby bunnies may look helpless, but their mother is just out feeding. She'll return at night to feed and snuggle them.*

Sometimes, leaving babies in a safe spot helps them survive. A good example are deer. Unlike their fawns, adults have a smell that attracts predators.

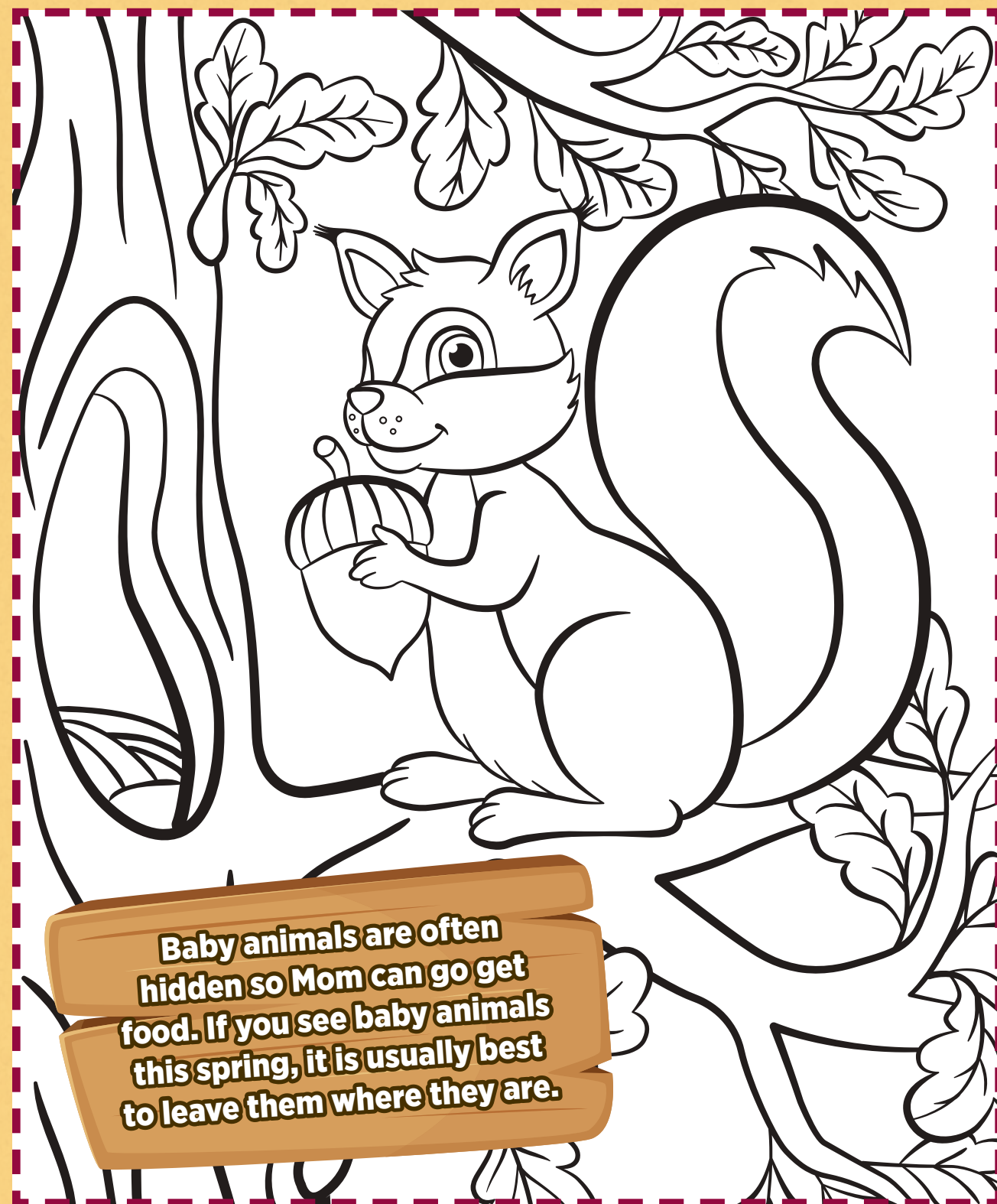
