

## RedRover Director of Field Services Beth Gammie



Beth Gammie is the Director of Field Services for RedRover, a national animal welfare nonprofit headquartered in Sacramento, California. In this role, Beth leads the RedRover Responders program which provides emergency animal sheltering in natural disasters and large-scale cruelty seizures throughout the United States and Canada.

Beth has experience in leading large-scale Trap-Neuter-Release (TNR) operations. She developed a comprehensive manual, "Humanely Managing Cat Overpopulation Sites," to help those trying to reduce cat overpopulation areas by bringing all affected parties together to make a plan to spay/neuter all the community cats, and rehome as many cats as possible.

She regularly leads trainings for humane societies, animal control agencies, and emergency response groups on Emergency Animal Sheltering. Beth also

presents on topics such as compassion resilience, large-scale TNR, and animal wellbeing in emergency shelters. Prior to this position, she volunteered for RedRover and other animal welfare groups.

Beth has a Bachelor of Science degree in Kinesiology from the University of Illinois, a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Illinois, and a Master's degree in Counseling from Arizona State University.

When not on deployment, Beth acts as staff to her four cats, and enjoys hiking and kayaking.
