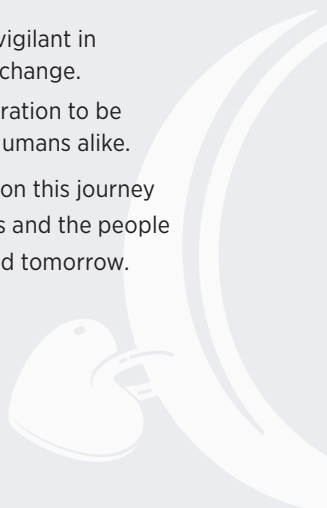
funding, we will persevere in our unwavering commitment to:

# RedRover Readers Launches in North Dakota! ✨

**WE'RE EXCITED TO ANNOUNCE THAT THE REDROVER READERS PROGRAM IS EXPANDING TO NORTH DAKOTA!** This valiant effort is led by Chelsea Hughes, LMSW, Clinical Assistant Professor of Social Work at the University of North Dakota (UND), and a trained **RedRover Readers** facilitator.

Chelsea completed the **RedRover Readers** training in 2022, and quickly recognized the program's potential to foster empathy, reflection, and meaningful dialogue among youth. After building a strong relationship with our team and thoughtfully preparing materials, she secured a competitive UND CONNECT grant to pilot the program locally. Together, we planned a workshop, prepared her to facilitate, and customized materials to ensure a strong launch.

In February, Chelsea hosted a **RedRover Readers** training in partnership with the Grand Forks Public Library, preparing 10 social work and education student volunteers to lead readings



in their community. The workshop will demonstrate the program's animal-themed, discussion-based approach for children, providing participants with practical tools and confidence to lead engaging read-aloud sessions. ♥

## What does a KIND classroom look like?

**THERE ARE NOTICEABLE EXAMPLES OF KINDNESS AT NORTHLAKE ELEMENTARY SCHOOL'S CAMPUS IN SACRAMENTO, CALIFORNIA, EVERY DAY.** They had just celebrated Random Acts of Kindness week, and while students were arriving for school, there was a table swarmed by students picking up bracelets and stickers to give to their friends.

Teachers regularly encourage kindness and share examples of what it means to be kind with their students, while reminding them how to help each other. Here are just some of the ways this school is teaching kindness with intention:

Northlake recently hosted a kindness-themed art show that featured animal art. Students created colorful creations of dogs, penguins, snakes, owls, chickens, and bees.

One classroom cares for their teacher's dog, Bunny, when she visits, taking turns showing kindness and responsibility by taking her on walks and out to potty. And all students have the chance to learn how to treat service dogs with kindness and respect, by reading aloud to them at their events.

This school also made the choice to bring *Kind News*™ magazine to all of their students. Since 1985, hundreds of educators and animal advocates have used *Kind News* magazine as a resource for children. The magazine includes fun games and engaging articles about kids helping animals.

We are grateful to Ms. Swoboda and her sixth-grade students at Northlake Elementary School, who collaborated with the **RedRover Readers** program and

allowed us to be on the scene when students were interacting with *Kind News* magazine. The students shared their impressions of the magazine to help us inspire more people to #SpreadKindNews farther, and promote kindness for people and animals everywhere.

**This spring, we launched our #SpreadKindNews campaign to help us get this unique, animal-themed magazine into more than 1,000 new classrooms in 2026. ♥**

# RedRover Responders Reaches 300 Deployments

**IN 2025, WE CONTINUED OUR WORK SHELTERING ANIMALS IN TIMES OF CRISIS, AND BUILDING STRONGER PET COMMUNITIES.** We hit a milestone for the **RedRover Responders** program, deploying for the 300th time for animals in need across the nation! This milestone was reached while assisting Humane World for Animals, formerly called the Humane Society of the United States, in the daily care and comfort of more than 80 dogs and puppies rescued from 3 Florida properties suspected of dogfighting.

RedRover, formerly known as United Animal Nations (UAN), initially addressed diverse animal welfare concerns through its Emergency Animal Rescue Service (EARS program): such as elephant poaching, pet overpopulation, horse slaughter, whaling, and a variety of other animal cruelty and abuse situations. Now, with more than 4,800 specially-trained volunteers in the United States and Canada, we've evolved the program as we know it today: **RedRover Responders**, providing domestic violence shelter renovations to allow survivors' pets on-site, dog unchaining projects, Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return operations, pet wellness clinics, disaster and cruelty response, and more.

**"Helping animals, and in turn their people, in crisis has been at the heart of all that RedRover does since we were founded in 1987,"** said RedRover President and CEO Katie Campbell. **"Reaching this milestone is such a proud moment for us, knowing we have helped tens of thousands of animals in their deepest time of need. # Bring RedRover Responders to Your Community!

**AS A FOUNDING MEMBER OF NARSC, THE NATIONAL ANIMAL RESCUE AND SHELTERING COALITION,** RedRover is a known expert on emergency sheltering and disaster preparedness for pets. **But did you know we offer free trainings directly to organizations to help them be better-equipped to respond to disasters and large-scale cruelty seizures?**

In early 2026, Director of Field Services Beth Gammie delivered disaster preparedness training in Virginia and New York to animal

shelters, Animal Control agencies, rescues, shelters, and wildlife rehabilitators — teaching participants the basics of disaster response and management, and how to prepare their agency to endure and respond to natural disasters.

**Our RedRover Responders team is always at the ready to support communities in crisis.** Additionally, we are committed to helping communities build their local capacity to prevent, prepare, and respond to disasters effectively. All of the national

groups combined don't have enough resources to be everywhere at once, but reinforcing local leaders ensures that there are always trained groups on the ground to help animals and their people in crisis. ❤️

# Permanent Grants for Homeless Shelter Pet Housing Programs



A study on unhoused individuals found that 93% of men and 96% of women said that they would not stay at a homeless shelter if pets were not allowed.\*

**REDROVER BELIEVES PETS ARE FAMILY, AND RECOGNIZES THE POWER OF THE HUMAN-ANIMAL BOND** and the

strength it brings to those experiencing crisis, such as homelessness.

Thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor, we've expanded our Safe Housing homeless shelter pilot program into a permanent fixture in the application process. Safe Housing grants of up to \$60,000 are available for U.S. homeless shelters to start a pet housing program. ❤️

between multiple training events and exciting new partnerships.

In January, our President and CEO, Katie Campbell, joined the American Bar Association for a virtual webinar and also attended the Veterinary Meeting and Expo (VMX) alongside board director, Amanda Landis-Hanna, DVM, to help raise awareness for survivors escaping abuse with their pets across the legal and veterinary fields.

The Don't Forget the Pets (DFTP) collaborative project with Greater Good Charities is off to a fast start with

in-person workshops in North Carolina, California, and Minnesota, and virtual presentations from the Animal League Defense Fund and Seattle's One Health Clinic. In March, we hosted the DFTP Housing People and Pets In Crisis workshop in our national headquarters located in Sacramento.

And, we're excited to share that the Reed Smith Law Firm is offering free support to shelters in our DFTP Coaching program who are facing challenges with insurance and zoning — a common challenge for many of the domestic violence and animal organizations we work to support. ## Adrienne's DV Survivor Story

### BLU\* IS MORE THAN JUST ADRIENNE'S\* EMOTIONAL SUPPORT DOG; HE IS A LIFESAVER.

On three separate occasions, he had warned her of a drastic drop in blood sugar, intervening in time for her to have a much-needed meal. When Adrienne and her granddaughter fled the domestic violence they'd been enduring, Blu was right by their side.

The shelter they fled to was not able to welcome pets, but they connected Adrienne with a foster program that would board him. But Adrienne could see how being apart from Blu was affecting her granddaughter; to give her granddaughter a sense of normalcy in a difficult time, they needed to see him.

Adrienne worked with her advocate to find a boarding facility where they could visit Blu weekly, then applied for a **RedRover Relief Safe Escape** grant. Finally, the time came to leave the shelter and begin the next chapter of their lives together in peace. ♥

### More than 4,800 Valiant Volunteers



In 2025, our volunteers dedicated 3,280 hours to sheltering animals rescued from alleged cruelty and dogfighting, offering humane Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return (TNVR) services for community cats, and providing resources for pet families through community programs: spay/neuter vouchers, vaccines, and safe spaces for family dogs. The fair market value of our volunteers' hours worked in 2025 is \$114,111. Read on for how volunteers supported our 300th deployment milestone!

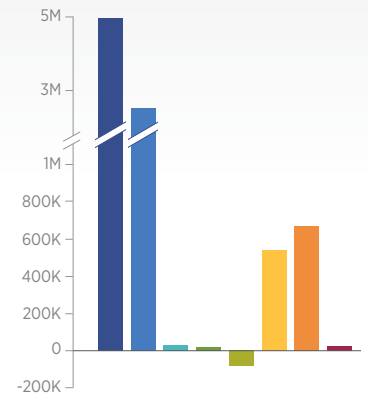


## RedRover Financials

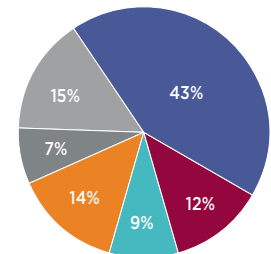

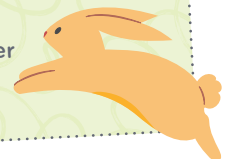

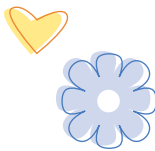
# RedRover Relief

**PROVIDES FINANCIAL AND EMOTIONAL SUPPORT** to good Samaritans, animal rescuers, and pet families in need of emergency veterinary care. The program also offers direct assistance to help those experiencing abuse or homelessness find safe spaces together with their pets, and provides grants to domestic violence, animal, and homeless shelters to develop pet housing programs. In 2025, the **RedRover Relief** program supported pet families when they needed it most:



- **700\* pets received urgent veterinary treatment** with \$173,132 in financial assistance
- **5,803 animals were helped** through consultation and other referrals from RedRover staff

## FOR ALL OF US AT REDROVER, PETS ARE FAMILY.

As costs continue to rise, accessing veterinary care becomes harder each year. We see firsthand on the **RedRover Relief** Urgent Care program team that the number of applications continues to grow, year after year.



Our 9,000th grant recipient, a case we took on in 2025, was one of the many pet parents facing this challenge. Rebecca had fallen in love with her dog, Tica, 16 years earlier after finding her with her mom and 4 siblings at only 2 days old. She was able to find good homes for them, but could not part with Tica. Rebecca came to us seeking

financial assistance after her otherwise very healthy, active, senior dog had suddenly contracted heartworm.

Many people apply for a **RedRover Relief** Urgent Care grant when they have nowhere else to turn. With the financial need ever-growing, services becoming more automated, and the societal barriers stacking, it's heartwarming to connect with another person who understands your love for your animals when you are experiencing hardship.

For our team, it's the moment we hear the ease in someone's voice, often through a big sigh of relief and tears, that we know this program's impact goes far beyond financial assistance... it provides relief through empathy, connection, and hope. Our pets are our family, too, and we're grateful when we can be a heart on the other side of the line to listen, provide resources, and offer financial support, like we could for Rebecca and her little Tica. ♥



## Through the RedRover Relief Safe Housing grant program in 2025:



- **297 animals escaped abuse** and **8,400 nights of pet boarding were provided** through RedRover's Safe Escape grant program
- **7,895 estimated pets of domestic violence survivors helped** through RedRover's Safe Housing grant program
- **28 domestic violence shelters awarded \$1,335,518** to build pet housing programs—our biggest grant year yet!

## IN 2023, WE LAUNCHED OUR AMBITIOUS 25 BY 2025

**CAMPAIGN** in partnership with Greater Good Charities (powered by PetSmart Charities) to help ensure that 25% of domestic violence (DV) shelters became pet friendly by the end of 2025.

With 2025 just in our rearview, we've concluded the campaign, but the work continues. In mid-March, supporters joined us to wrap up the campaign by sharing highlights, challenges, and plans for the future. While we ended the campaign a bit short of our ambitious goal at 20.45%, we know it's essential to keep this momentum going.

**The short version: we're as committed as ever!** We're still providing grants, training, and technical assistance to create pet housing programming across the country. We're beyond grateful for everyone who joined the campaign—from domestic violence organizations, to animal organizations, to individuals who want to create change in their communities. You helped us raise awareness and create change. But let's not stop here.

# RedRover Responders

**SHELTERS AND CARES** for animals displaced by natural disasters and rescued from cruelty, provides hands-on assistance with building pet housing programs for domestic violence survivors, and offers community assistance for animals in need in the United States and Canada. In 2025, the **RedRover Responders** program staff and volunteers helped thousands of animals during a remarkable year of unwavering care:

- **3,369 animals** in need were helped through emergency sheltering and services
- **3,280 hours of volunteer work** provided care, resources, and time for animals in need
- **a force of more than 4,800 compassionate volunteers** dedicated to supporting pet families and keeping them together

## LAST YEAR WAS MONUMENTAL FOR THE REDROVER RESPONDERS TEAM WITH MORE THAN 3,300 ANIMALS ASSISTED — increasing our animals helped by almost 1,000 compared to 2024!

During 16 deployments, with 11 partners, across 12 communities, our volunteers contributed an estimated 3,280 hours on the ground supporting animals. Whether they were vaccinating pets at free wellness clinics, humanely trapping cats for community Trap-Neuter-Vaccinate-Return projects, providing animal care during a cruelty case, or building safe enclosures for outdoor dogs and more, it was a year of hard work and incredible outcomes.

This year also brought new milestones and exciting accomplishments! We collaborated with the Parker Project on the Navajo Nation for an inaugural event with their mobile spay/neuter clinic. This deployment was the epitome of access to care: free spay/neuter and veterinary care brought directly to

the doors of families and pets in need, including folks caring for large numbers of community dogs. With many families caring for over 10 dogs, it can be impossible to afford surgery, let alone the logistics of getting all the animals to a veterinarian.

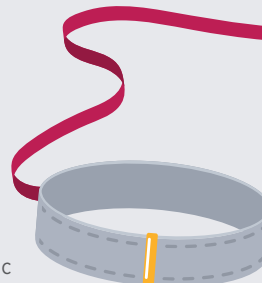
We partnered with Banfield Foundation for the first time to build safe enclosures for outdoor dogs on the reservation. With a variety of other opportunities volunteers can choose from, we were thrilled that for this deployment, six of our volunteers chose to join us in New Mexico (even over opportunities in sunny Hawai'i!), with one volunteer coming all the way from Ukraine!

We also held our first free pet supply wellness clinic in the Northeast region, serving more than 400 pets and their families in Vermont. This event became so huge that we needed the city's assistance, and had to close shop early because we ran out of vaccines. Fortunately, after seeing the need in this area, we are excited to return for 2026, well-equipped to support this community. **What a year!** ♥
